City of Pelican Rapids Park Board Meeting
Monday, October 28th, 2013

The City of Pelican Rapids held it's Park Board meeting on Monday,October 28th at 8:00a.m., at City Hall Council Chambers, City Hall, City Hall 315 N. Broadway.
Meeting was called to order at 8:11 a.m.

Board members present: Dave Gottenborg, Van Holmgren, Len Zierke, Denise Magnusson. Brian Olson and Don Solga were also in attendance.

Motion to approve September minutes was made by Magnusson and seconded by Gottenborg.

Council actions since last meeting: None

Velo Land: Solga sent a letter to Velo regarding donation of the land to the city. Park board decided this will be tabled until a spring meeting.

Swimming Pool: Pool Board members have been talking with W.C.I., they have a meeting on October 28th at 6:00. They will be looking at a list of possible donors and feasibility study.

Brown Field: Park Board discussed an open air shelter like the one in Peterson Park. The shelter would cost between \$7,000 and 10,000 for the wood structure. Possible ways to raise funds were discussed. These included contacting groups to raise money and later maybe labor provided by "Sentence to Serve". Also Rotary and Oktoberfest was brought up as possible donors. Need to come up with costs and Gottenborg will bring it up to Rotary. Olson will work on other estimates as to other materials, i.e. metal, wood, steel, and costs of each.

Bike Trail: Solga reported meeting in D.L. and gave presentation of bike trail and bonding list. Meeting went well. Different plans will be presented to Senate Capital Investments Committee in D.L. Four different plans from Perham to Maplewood Park and three plans from P.R. to the Park. The public will need to be to have more meetings in order to inform them of these various routes. This would be a \$9 million dollar project. Cities would have to contribute \$300,000.

Ben spoke at the Maplewood Park' open house of this project. Projected start of bike trail would be 2015, 2018.

Chairs: Magnusson will pick them up and store them in well house 14.

Pergola: Karl Grefsrud will be sent a "Thank You". He reduced labour by approximately 2/3rds. Oktoberfest should also be thanked.

Barbecue Pits: Rotary is aware that Karl is working on this project.

Motion to adjourn was made by Holmgren and seconded by Zierke. Adjourned at 8:46 a.m.
