701.07 PARKING REGULATIONS Subdivision 6. Parking Regulations

Snow emergency. A SNOW EMERGENCY means every occurrence of snow-fall where snow has accumulated to a depth of two inches or more. Each snow emergency shall commence upon the accumulation of snow to a depth of two inches or more, and shall remain in effect until snow has been cleared from the streets to the full width or until the Public Works Superintendent has declared that snow has been adequately removed from the streets.

Snow emergency parking. It shall be unlawful for any person to park or leave standing a vehicle on any street during a snow emergency. This parking restriction shall be in effect until snow has been cleared from the street to the full width or until the Public Works Superintendent has declared the snow has been adequately removed.

Exempt from this regulation are times of special events at area schools, funeral homes and churches.

No parking anytime on the south side of Southeast Fourth Avenue lying between Trunk Highway 59 and Southeast First Street and no parking on the west side of Trunk Highway 59 between Southwest Third Avenue and Southwest Fifth Avenue.

In addition to the foregoing snow removal parking requirements, the Chief of Police or Street Superintendent may direct that notices be placed on vehicles parked on any particular street or avenue, or that entire streets or avenues may be posted with a notice requiring all parked vehicles to be removed from all or portions of such streets or avenues as needed from time to time for street cleaning, street maintenance, snow removal or other purposes, as needed on a temporary basis.

The Council may by resolution adopt other parking regulations that it deems necessary to preserve the free flow of traffic, prevent accidents or provide for the public safety or welfare.

ADOPTED this 27th day of September, 2016, by the City Council of the City of Pelican Rapids, Minnesota.

ATTENTION MOBILE HOME OWNERS & RENTERS

Be sure to prepare your water meters and pipes for winter.

If you are leaving for the winter, call a plumber and have your pipes blown out. Then call the City of Pelican Rapids at 863-7076 and have your meter removed. Be sure to leave your heat tape plugged into a working outlet so the pipe in the ground does not freeze.

If you are going to be staying in your mobile home for the winter, please make sure to insulate and wrap all pipes and your meter with heat tape and leave the heat tape plugged into a working outlet.



Thank you for keeping your pipes safe for the winter ~ it is not fun for anyone if a pipe breaks.

ATENCION DUEÑOS DE TRAILA & RENTEROS

Si usted no va a estar durante el invierno, llame a un plomero para que purge la tubería. Después llame a el departamento de la ciudad de Pelican Rapids al 863-7076 para que remuevan el medidor de agua. Asegurese de dejar la cinta de calentamiento conectada para que las pipas no se congelen.

Si usted se va a quedar en su traila durante el invierno, favor de asegurarse que las pipas estén bien aisladas y su medidor envuelto con la cinta para calentar conectada a una toma electrica que funcione.

Gracias por ayudar que sus pipas se encuentren seguras durante el invierno. No es nada agradable cuando las pipas se congelan.
